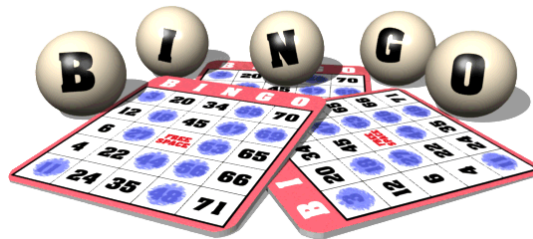

All athletes who plan to participate in Spring Sports must turn in all required forms and fees **AT ATHLETIC CHECK-IN before** the first day of practice. Athletic Department clearance is required prior to participation in any practice or try-out.

1. Physical signed by a doctor (valid for one year from date of physical)
2. Authorization for Athletic Participation
3. CHSAA Form 1b – Student Eligibility Information Form
4. Emergency Information Card
5. Participation fee (\$130 per participant; \$195 for Private or Home Schooled athletes)

All portions of the forms must be signed and dated. New forms are required for each season.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT OPPORTUNITIES

-Students in their junior or senior year of high school may be eligible to enroll for coursework at a state institution of higher education, provided specific eligibility and academic criteria are satisfied. Parents and students interested in more information about concurrent enrollment opportunity options are encouraged to review participation guidelines described in Superintendent Policy 6285 or to request information from the Counseling Office.

-Any pupil who is enrolled in the 11th or 12th grade of a school district, who is deemed by the pupil and the pupil’s parents or legal guardians to be in need of course work at a higher academic level than that available at the pupil’s school, or is deemed by the high school to be in need of a different environment is eligible to apply to an institution of higher education.

-Student is limited to two courses per academic term.

-A principal may override the choice of a specific course because (1) it is not rigorous enough, or (2) your high school DOES offer an equivalent course.

-Students interested in participating should contact the high school principal at least two months (60 days) prior to the enrollment date.

-Courses taken shall count for credit towards graduation requirements when official transcripts are provided to Legacy. These courses will not be weighted in GPA calculation. Method used is 1 college credit (semester) = .25 high school (Carnegie) credit. When a student is enrolling to obtain college credit only, all tuition, books, and fees will be paid by the student.

POST-SECONDARY PLANNING

Students can access information on colleges, scholarships, careers, and the military in the Counseling Office. College and career representatives visit Legacy High School in the Counseling Office throughout the year. Dates and times vary, and will be announced in the newsletter, on the bulletin, and are posted in the Counseling Office and on the Counseling webpage.

COLLEGE PLANNING NIGHTS FOR 2015/2016.

College Planning Night for *Juniors* - Wednesday, January 20, 6:30 p.m.

Legacy will hold its annual College Planning Night for juniors on Wednesday, January 20, at 6:30 p.m. in the Auditorium. Information will be presented regarding timelines, choosing colleges, financial aid and scholarships.

CHECKLIST FOR SENIORS: January/February

- Complete and submit college applications – be aware of deadlines.
- Check scholarships on the Counseling web page.
- Meet with visiting colleges and trade school representatives or visit the school of interest to assist in narrowing your choice list.
- Parents should begin preparation to complete income tax returns early to ensure accurate information when applying for student financial aid.
- Complete and submit student financial aid forms.

Applying for college can be a long process. Students should begin immediately to avoid the rush and to help eliminate errors.

NAVIANCE

Students at Legacy High School will all have an account with the Internet based program Naviance. Students will be reached by a counselor through one of their classes during each semester to accomplish various goals related to the state mandated ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Plan). Students will create Naviance account logins and passwords with the help of the Counseling Department. Through Naviance, students will be given tasks to accomplish which focus on preparing for life after high school. **Students who have questions about their Naviance accounts should consult the Counseling Webpage where an informational sheet will be located.** If they still have questions, students should see their counselor.

COLLEGE/CAREER EXPLORATIONS

Students will be asked to complete certain tasks using their Naviance accounts. Included in these tasks are the completion of a personality profile entitled *Do What You Are* and completion of a Career Interest Profiler. Once students complete these two tasks they will be able to see computer generated recommendations for careers and related educational avenues such as college degree programs which prepare students for their chosen career paths. Naviance also houses many other related tools such as college and scholarship search engines. All of these tasks are Internet based and can be accessed 24/7 from any Internet connection once students have created their accounts.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS / TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

Once students have completed college searches and/or found schools that interest them, they can add those schools to parts of their Naviance account listed under the “Colleges” tab. If they want to simply save a school for future consideration, they can place it in the “Colleges I’m Thinking About” section. Once a student has decided to apply to that school, they can move it to the “Colleges I’m Applying To” area. From this area, students can request that their transcripts be sent to the college by clicking the “request transcript” box. Counselors will then see the request and send it to the appropriate institution. ***It should be noted, however, that using Naviance does not take the place of completing a college application. It simply allows students to submit supporting documentation such as transcripts and letters of recommendation to schools.

***Per school policy, Legacy will attach each student’s official state ACT taken during their junior year to their transcript. If students want additional standardized test scores (i.e. SAT, AP, or other ACT tests) to be sent to colleges, they must send said scores themselves. Instructions for how to do this are available at www.actstudent.org or collegeboard.org.

COMMON APPLICATION SCHOOLS

It is important that students accurately mark the Common App box for each school that has Common App as an option. Students should change the drop down box from “Unknown” to “No” unless they are certain they will be applying to the college using the independent Common App website. Requests that have the “Unknown” or “Yes” boxes marked may not allow transcripts to be sent by Legacy and may cause students to miss important application deadlines.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Legacy students will also use Naviance to request and submit teacher letters of recommendation to colleges. Once in the “Colleges” tab, students will go to “Colleges I’m Applying To” where they will be able to “add/cancel requests” under the “Teacher Recommendations” heading. This will allow teachers to upload a letter of recommendation to the student’s account.

***Students must provide specific details regarding deadlines for the letters to be sent and to which colleges the teacher should send their letters.

***Sending the letter of recommendation request through Naviance should not replace a face to face conversation with the teacher, but serve as an additional means of communication and should include the detailed information above (to which college(s) the teacher should send their letter and the deadline for the letter to be sent). Students are highly encouraged to prepare a resume and present it to the requesting teacher as early as possible so that the teacher may have the time and resources to write and

upload the letter of recommendation. Students can use the “letter of recommendation worksheet” for this purpose.

***If students already have a paper copy of a teacher letter of recommendation, they have two options for how to proceed. They may ask the teacher to upload the document to Naviance like any other situation and continue like normal or they can bring the letter to a counselor who can scan it and upload it into Naviance for them.

SENIOR MEMO

Seniors will receive a Senior Memo two to three times a year. This memo contains information about college visits, timelines, careers, and scholarships. Parents should read these memos with their student. All Senior Memos are posted on the Counseling Webpage and are also emailed to students through their Naviance accounts.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are three main areas where students may access information about scholarships. One source is the college to which the student has been accepted. This information is available in most college view books, through the college’s financial aid office, and on the college website. A second source for scholarships is the Internet. A list of websites is available in the Counseling Office and on the Counseling Webpage. Another source for scholarship information is the Counseling Office on the scholarship bulletin board. Students are encouraged to check the listing at least once a month. If a student thinks he/she may qualify for one or more of the posted scholarships, he/she should come to the Counseling Office for more information and for the specific application(s). Please pay attention to application deadlines.

CAUTION: Beware of scholarship scams. If you want to know more, www.finaid.org has a list of common scholarship scams and additional information that is very useful.

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER

Students who plan on participating in NCAA Division I or II college athletics must register with the NCAA. To register, students will visit the website www.eligibilitycenter.org, where they will develop a login and password during their junior or senior year of high school. Once students have registered, they must request a transcript to be sent from Legacy High School to the NCAA. This is done electronically via the www.eligibilitycenter.org website. Once students request the transcript via the eligibility center website, they must also go to their Naviance account and create a transcript request to the NCAA. (More information about this process can be found on the Counseling Website.) Students must also have their ACT scores sent to the NCAA directly from ACT; scores are not accepted by the NCAA if they are sent from LHS. To do this, students should visit www.actstudent.org and have their scores sent to the NCAA (school code #9999). It is the student’s responsibility to ensure the classes they are taking will meet the outlined NCAA needs. Mr. Romano is available to assist students in the process, but cannot guarantee that a student will be cleared by the NCAA. Through the website, students can see a complete list of all approved courses for any school they have attended, including Legacy High School.

PEER TUTORS

SAT- On Wednesday, December 23rd the Colorado Department of education announced that a selection committee chose the College Board, makers of the SAT, over the ACT testing company, which has been used to assess Colorado juniors since 2001. As of March 2016, the new design of the SAT will be used (one of the changes: there is no penalty for guessing!). **** SAT, SAT Subject Tests, National ACT tests, and ACT Writing Tests are offered throughout the year to all students for a fee. Students can find registration information at: www.collegeboard.org or www.actstudent.org. Students may take these tests at any grade level, however the tests are designed and recommended for students to take during the spring of their junior year or fall of their senior year. College admission requirements vary. It is suggested that students check the testing admission requirements for higher education programs that they are considering.**

Counseling Tip: *Effective studying may not seem like the most exciting topic – but think of the big picture. The better your study skills, the better you’ll do in school. Better grades open up opportunities. That might mean getting into a better college, technical program, or military program, or getting a better job. In other words, a bright future starts with working on a few study strategies now.*

District outlines deadlines for 2016-17 Choice process

Submit application by January 29th deadline for priority consideration

Last year, the Adams 12 Five Star Schools received more than 4,000 Choice applications for the 2015-16 school year. In accordance with the state's open enrollment law, the district's Choice Program allows for students to apply to attend schools outside of their attendance area boundary. Those who are approved for Choice are responsible for their own transportation.

Both in-district and out-of-district students can apply for Choice. Out-of-district Choice requests are considered after in-district applications. Acceptance to a Choice school is based upon several criteria: availability of space, sufficient teaching staff, appropriate programs and the necessary facilities for special needs students. While not a guarantee, when possible, priority will be given to sibling applications so that families will attend the same school.

Adams 12 Five Star Schools will publicize the schools open to Choice for the 2016-2017 school year on December 1, 2015. These will be published in the December issue of the *Five Star Journal* and will be posted online at the district web site at www.adams12.org/choice_schools. Families with children already attending schools that are not open to Choice are eligible to submit an application for their existing student to remain at the school or for younger siblings to attend the school with their older siblings.

The Choice application will be available beginning December 1st at <http://www.adams12.org/choice/application>. For families without computer access, applications will be available at each school and at the Educational Support Center.

The deadline for priority consideration is January 29, 2016 and is not first-come, first-served. Parents and students submitting an application for priority consideration will be notified of the results of their application no later than the third week of February. If the number of requests exceeds the spaces available in a given school, the district will hold a lottery.

The second deadline to submit a Choice application for the 2016-2017 school year will be March 31, 2016. As with the first round, if the number of requests exceeds the spaces available for priority consideration in a given school, the district will hold a lottery. Notification of approval or denial will be made no later than the third week of April.

In addition to the two deadlines above, in some years a third round of Choice may be held in August & September if space is available. While the 1st and 2nd round of Choice is lottery based, applications in the 3rd round of Choice are processed on a first-come, first-served basis and submitted at the school.

The Adams 12 Admissions Office determines the acceptance of Choice requests. For traditional schools, extended-day tuition-based kindergarten **does not** go through the Choice Program. For magnet schools, extended-day tuition-based kindergarten **does** go through the Choice Program. In-district students are not required to apply for Choice to attend secondary programs like Horizon SOAR, Legacy 2000, Mountain Range Global Studies, Northglenn High STEM Program and Thornton High International Baccalaureate (IB). Application and acceptance to those programs goes through the individual school. Out-of-district students wishing to attend high school programs that are not school-wide must apply for both Choice and with the program. If the school is not open to Choice then the program is closed to out-of-district students. If the student is not selected in the Choice lottery, they are waitlisted to the school and program.

Parents of extended-day, tuition-based kindergarteners at traditional schools should note that enrollment in that program does not automatically mean the student will go to the same school for first grade. The student must apply through the Choice Program for first grade placement if he/she wants to go to a school other than his/her boundary school. Also note that the school the child attended for kindergarten may not necessarily be open for Choice. Parents of extended-day, tuition-based kindergarteners for magnet schools do not need to reapply for Choice as their Choice approval remains in effect through the highest grade served at their magnet school.

The duration of a Choice placement is valid only for the grades which that school serves. For example, if a student attends a Choice elementary school, the approval is valid to the end of fifth grade, as long as there are no significant changes in that school's enrollment or facilities. When a student transitions from elementary to middle school or from middle to high school, they must reapply for Choice. If they don't, the student's placement automatically reverts to their boundary school.

Five Star Diploma Communication – Fall 2015

For over a decade, Adams 12 Five Star Schools has awarded the Five Star Diploma to graduating students who have met a number of rigorous academic criteria, including participation and high achievement on state-mandated assessments. The Five Star Diploma signifies a student has completed additional requirements toward high school graduation that are beyond the minimum requirements to earn a high school diploma from Adams 12 Five Star Schools.

In the spring of 2015, House Bill 15-1323 was passed by the Colorado Legislature and signed by the governor. One portion of this new law allows parents to excuse a child from state assessments in English language arts, math, science, and social studies. The new law also precludes a school district from imposing negative consequences, including prohibiting school attendance, imposing an unexcused absence, or prohibiting participation in extracurricular activities on the student or the parent.

Because this new law allows parents to excuse students from certain state assessments, many of the meaningful criteria of the Five Star Diploma can no longer be mandatory, given the requirement that the district not impose negative consequences for students excused from state tests.

Consequently, the Five Star Diploma will be discontinued for the graduating classes of 2019 and beyond. For students in the graduating classes of 2016, 2017, and 2018 who have met the criteria for the Five Star Diploma during the 2014-15 school year as well as prior school years, the Five Star Diploma will still be awarded.
