### CHECKLIST FOR SENIORS: September & October

- Update your Naviance Account
- Sign up and take/retake the ACT and/or SAT, if needed
- Meet with representatives from college/trade schools – watch announcements and the Counseling website for dates and times
- Visit colleges/trade schools of interest to assist in narrowing your choice list
- Narrow your college choices to three or four schools

- Gather letters of recommendation – allow three weeks for teacher/counselors to complete
- Write your college essay, if needed
- Begin filling out applications

Parents should plan to prepare and file income tax returns early in January – most colleges begin awarding financial aid in March.

Applying for college can be a lengthy process. Students should begin immediately to avoid the rush and to help eliminate errors. Students may request official transcripts through Naviance or in the Counseling Office. **It is recommended that students try to complete their college applications by Thanksgiving Break to ensure that application deadlines are met.**

## **COLLEGE VISITS**

We have many colleges visit Legacy. Students should check the Counseling website, the Senior Memo, and the bulletin board outside the Counseling Office for exact dates and times. Updates will also be provided in our daily announcements and listed on Naviance. Please get a pass from your counselor or the counseling Secretary, Ms. Johnson, if you would like to attend a college visit.

## SENIOR MEMO

The senior memo will be a means of communication with students about college visits, timelines, careers, and scholarships. Parents should read these memos with their student. The senior memos are posted on the Counseling website and available in the Counseling Office.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

There are three main areas where students may access information about scholarships. One source is the college to which the student has been accepted. This information is available in most college view books, through the college's financial aid office, and on the college website. A second source for scholarships is the Internet. A list of websites is available in the Counseling Office and on the Counseling website. Another source for scholarship information is the Counseling Office. We will post all scholarships on our website as well as on the college bulletin board. Students are encouraged to check the listing at least once a month. If a student believes he/she may qualify for one or more of the posted scholarships, he/she should come to the Counseling Office for more information and for the specific application(s). Please pay attention to the application deadlines.

**CAUTION: Beware of scholarship scams.** If you want to know more, [www.finaid.org](http://www.finaid.org) has a list of common scholarship scams and additional information that is very useful.

### *NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER*

Students who plan on participating in NCAA Division I or II college athletics must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center. To register, students will visit the website [www.eligibilitycenter.org](http://www.eligibilitycenter.org), where they will develop a login and password during their junior or senior year of high school. Once students have registered with the Eligibility Center, they must request a transcript to be sent from Legacy High School to the Clearinghouse. This is done electronically via the [www.eligibilitycenter.org](http://www.eligibilitycenter.org) website. Students must also have their ACT scores sent to the NCAA directly from ACT; scores are not accepted by the NCAA if they are sent from LHS. To do this, students should visit [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org) and have their scores sent to the NCAA (school code #9999). It is the student's responsibility to ensure the classes they are taking will meet the outlined NCAA Eligibility Center. Mr. Romano is available to assist students in the process, but cannot guarantee that a student will be cleared by the NCAA. Through the Eligibility Center website, students can see a complete list of all approved courses by looking up each school they have attended and reading its 48H Form.

## **Adams 12 to Improve Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) Process for High School GT Students**

*New process will enhance collaboration and student ownership; integrate with ICAP*

In response to overwhelming feedback from parents, students and teachers, and in order to create more meaning, ownership and collaboration in the Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) process, we will be integrating ALPs with the Individual Career and Academic Plans (ICAPs) for all Gifted/Talented (GT) high school students starting in the 2015-16 school year. The ICAP is a requirement for all high school students. Its intent is to establish personalized academic and career goals for students, explore postsecondary career and educational opportunities and align coursework and curriculum. In many ways, this overlaps with the ALP, in which the student is creating a plan for future academic and personal success.

What it will look like:

- Students will complete 4 brief surveys over the course of the year helping them set goals and strategies, and monitor progress toward those goals
- Students will select a cooperating teacher to help them through the process
- The student will collaborate with both parents and the cooperating teacher at regular intervals

The aims of this shift for high school students are to foster:

- **Empowerment** by giving students “*choice and voice*” in the process
- **Efficient** use of teacher and student time by integrating with the ICAP
- **Effective** and *meaningful* student participation and ownership

Collaboration is key to the ALP process, and should involve all stakeholders – students, parents and school personnel! At this time, this integration will only impact high school students (grades 9-12).

The Colorado Department of Education recognizes this integration as a best practice, and even has a ‘fast facts’ document on this topic available at <http://www.cde.state.co.us/gt/alp-blended-with-icap-dec2014>. We are excited about this opportunity to give GT students choice and voice, and make process meaningful and manageable for all.
