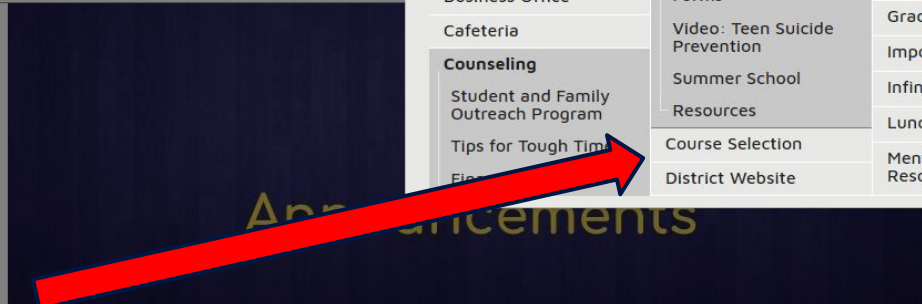
- Students in regular Math 8 will request Math 1 / 2 block
